## Technology improvements at Historical Society funded by GIACF

The Ishpeming Area Historical Society moved into a new space at the old Gossard (formerly Pioneer Square) October 1, 2013. Now that they've gone from moving in and getting



settled, they'll be working on upgrading the displays and showcases; announcing extended hours throughout the spring, summer and fall; and offering activities to share Ishpeming's history with residents and visitors alike. Just as important as the interaction with the community is cataloging the artifacts and documents. With a Greater Ishpeming Area Community Fund grant, a new laptop computer and "Past Perfect" museum software was purchased. Some of the many advantages of this program are preventing duplication of artifacts; keeping artifacts safely stored as a collection; and keeping track of members and donors. This is necessary in moving forward and growing the organization.

### **GIACF Provides Funds for Senior Art Classes**

The Greater Ishpeming Area Community Fund approved a grant for \$500 to the Ishpeming Commission on Aging in support of "Studio 320" an art appreciation class seniors. The program began at the Ishpeming Senior Center on November 1, 2012. Led by Katherine Savu, seniors learn and experience different art techniques using variety of mediums such as pen, pencil, water



colors, pastels, acrylic and oil paints. The group is named "Studio 320" as Ishpeming's Senior Center is located on 320 Pine St. In Ishpeming. Sessions for the classes are held on the first, third and fourth Thursdays of each month from 10:00 AM to 4:00 PM year round. There is no cost for the classes and interested people don't need to have prior drawing or painting experience.

## **Westwood Girls Softball receives support from GIACF**

A new high school athletic program needs assistance from a variety of sources to get started. The Greater Ishpeming Area Community Fund assisted the new Westwood Girls Softball program by funding the purchase of necessary equipment. Bats, balls and catcher's equipment were some of the supplies needed to get this sports program up and running. Approximately 24 girls are expected to play on this self-funded sports team, giving girls the opportunity to play softball together with their peers, not just on an adult women's league.
